ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

Annamalai University, one of the largest unitary, teaching, and residential universities in Southern Asia, was established in the year 1929 as per the Annamalai University Act 1928 (Tamil Nadu Act 1 of 1929). Now, the Annamalai University Act, 1928 has been repealed and replaced by the Annamalai University Act 2013 (Tamil Nadu Act 20 of 2013). His Excellency the Governor of Tamil Nadu is the Chancellor of the University.

The University is located at Annamalainagar, adjacent to Chidambaram town, the abode of Lord Nataraja, the Cosmic Dancer. The sprawling and scenic campus, spread over an extensive area of about 800 acres has the Faculties of Arts, Science, Indian Languages, Engineering and Technology, Education, Fine Arts, Agriculture, Medicine, Dentistry and Marine Sciences.

This University has, since its inception, aimed at imparting education in all fields of knowledge to thousands of students from across the country and abroad. Located in a rural setting in coastal district of Cuddalore in Tamil Nadu, the University has played a pivotal role in providing access to higher education to thousands of youth from economically and socially disadvantaged classes. In this respect, this university's service to the nation is tremendous.

In the past 85 years, the University has grown into a premier institution of higher learning and research. This is evident from the reports of Ministry of Science and Technology ("Measures of Performance of Universities in India: An analysis of the Publication Output in Science and Technology" published by CSIR – National Institute of Science and Technology and Development Studies, New Delhi – 2011, p.102) that ranks Annamalai University in the ninth position within the top ten Universities, among 600 and odd Universities in India, regarding the overall science publication output. In respect of Environmental Science, the University is ranked second, in Energy fourth, in Engineering Sciences fifth and in Biological Sciences eighth.

The Scimago (Scopus) survey for ranking Universities, educational institutions and sponsoring agencies across the world has rated Annamalai University to be 22nd in India, next to DRDO (Defence Research and Development Organisation) and 7th among Indian Universities (Scimago Institutions Ranking Scimago Research Group, 2012. Data source: Scopus®. www.scimagoir.com). The popular journal in India *Careers 360* has ranked Annamalai University to be second among four star rated universities among 33 such universities, and well above four other popular Universities of Tamilnadu. This survey has ranked only 10 universities in India above Annamalai University (India's Outstanding Universities, *Careers 360*, March, 2014. www.careers360.com, p.16-19).

All the ten faculties enjoy reputation across the globe for their distinguished record of effective teaching at the higher level and continuing research.

Numerous infrastructure facilities have been created to cope with the voluminous increase in enrolment of students in various on-campus programmes. New laboratory facilities in terms of space and quality equipment have been provided to cater to the needs of the learners and researchers. Video conferencing Edusat, Campus wide network, high-tech class room are some of added new facilities.

An Internal Quality Assurance Cell has been set up to monitor the quality of academic output. The departments of study conduct national and international seminars, symposia, workshops and conferences so as to enable teachers of the university to update their teaching and research at the global level. Students Progression Cell has been created to coach students for taking I.A.S. examinations. In keeping with the national policy of public health, the concept of 'No Smoking Zone' has been put into practice. A Students Welfare Cell, for on-campus students, has been set up to develop the individual's personality.

With a view to preparing the students for their profession and, in particular, to impart right attitudes and specific skills, the placement cells are functioning in three different locations. One to cater to the needs of the students in the Faculty of Engineering & Technology, another to cater to the needs of the students in the Faculty of Agriculture and the last, in the Department of Business Administration, for the students of Arts, Science, Education and Fine Arts. These cells advise students with regard to the choice of careers and higher studies. They help students to undergo in-plant training during semester holidays and also find suitable placement through campus interviews. They also conduct seminars and training courses periodically on Entrepreneurial Development Career Guidance Programme.

The 1200 bedded teaching hospital with a built-up area of about 6,00,000 sq.ft. provides basic as well as specialised health care services to various sections of the community in and around the campus.

Students can opt to attach themselves to any of the extracurricular services like NSS, NCC or YRC so as to develop social awareness, an interest in the community and with a clear ambition to improve their personality. To improve upon the physical fitness of the students, a sports pavilion with many infrastructure facilities has been established.

The University Library named after the eminent scholar statesman and former Vice-Chancellor Dr. Sir. C.P. Ramaswami Aiyer, is a key knowledge resource for the students and the staff. The Library is equipped with INTERNET connectivity and CD NETWORK station. Quite a good number of journals can be accessed through the Infonet facility.

The University has Memorandum of Understanding with many foreign Universities on research collaboration and exchange of students and staff as well.

There are sufficient numbers of hostels for the convenience of the students to pursue their studies on campus. Modern kitchen facilities, with safe drinking water, are available to ensure the hygienic conditions in the hostel.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

- i. The candidates should have undergone 10+2+3 (15) or 11+1+3 (15) pattern of study and passed qualifying examinations conducted by the respective State Board or CBSE or any other recognized Board of Education/ Examination and UG Degree Examination of the UGC Recognized Universities in any one of the school subjects offered by the Directorate of School Education at the Secondary / Higher Secondary Educational Level.
- ii. Candidates who have passed the UG or PG Degree in Open University System without qualifying in 11 years SSLC examination and 1 year of Pre-University Course (PUC) examination (or) 10+2 pattern of School Education examination shall not be considered for admission.

- iii. Candidates who have taken more than one main subject in Part-III /Part-IV under (Double/Triple major system) of the UG degree should have to choose only one of the main subjects and should have applied for that optional only. In such cases, mark obtained by the candidates in two/three major subjects shall be taken into account to arrive percentage of marks as stipulated in item (viii).
- iv. Candidates who have passed under Additional Degree Programme with less than three years duration are not eligible for admission.
- v. Candidates who have passed under Four year Dual Degree Programme with two major subjects under part-III are not eligible for admission.
- vi. Candidates who have qualified in PG Degree (Five Year Integrated Degree Programmes) under 10+2+5 or 11+1+5 pattern of study shall be considered for admission in such cases, the marks obtained by the candidates in the PG shall be taken into account for admission to the B.Ed. Degree Programme.
- vii.
 - a. Candidates who have done their UG degree in Applied Mathematics can apply for Mathematics.
 - b. Candidates who have done their UG degree in Applied Physics, Geophysics, Biophysics and Electronics can apply for Physical Science.
 - c. Candidates who have done their UG degree in Biochemistry and Applied Chemistry can apply for Physical Science.
 - d. Candidates who have done their UG degree in Biotechnology and Plant Biology & Plant Biotechnology can apply for Natural Science.
 - e. Candidates who have done their UG degree in Environmental Science and Microbiology can apply for Natural Science.
 - f. Post Graduate candidates in Economics and Commerce with 50% (irrespective of their UG marks) of marks in PG degree or inter disciplinary subjects which are being declared equivalent by the respective University can apply.
 - g. The candidates qualified in PG degree and secured 50% of marks with the same major subjects in UG Degree but not fulfilling the minimum percentage of marks required in UG degree as per community/category-wise will be eligible.
 - h. Candidates who have done their UG in the school subjects are eligible for admission to B.Ed. For others they have to obtain an equivalence certificate for the respective subjects from the concerned Universities to consider their admission to B.Ed. degree programme. The decision of the University shall be final in this regard.
 - i. Candidates who have done their UG level without language Tamil or other Indian Languages under Part-I and are awarded degree with English and Main subjects concerned need to be considered for admission to B.Ed. subject to the condition that they have to qualify in Tamil Language Test conducted by the TNPSC for the purpose of employment.

- viii. Candidates with the following marks in the Bachelor's Degree are eligible for admission to the course other than subjects like Economics and Commerce for which PG qualification is mandatory.

Note: Marks obtained by the candidates in the UG degree programme Part-III/IV Major and Allied including Practical (other than subjects Economics and Commerce) alone shall be taken into account to arrive at the percentage of marks mentioned above.

- a. Marks obtained by the candidates in UG degree under Part-IV Elective/ Allied/Extra Disciplinary subjects shall be taken into account to arrive at the percentage of marks mentioned above. Marks obtained under Part-V subjects shall not be taken into account to arrive percentage of marks.
 - b. Marks obtained by the candidates in PG degree (other than Economics, Commerce) shall not be considered for admission.
 - c. To arrive at above percentage of marks, the marks obtained by the candidates in Major/ Ancillary/Allied/Extra Disciplinary Subjects. (Part-III & IV) including practicals alone shall be taken into account.
 - d. Rounding of marks to the next higher integer shall not be permitted.
 - e. The candidates who have qualified in Bachelor's Degree under Open University System after passing 10th Std. and +2 examinations shall alone be considered for admission to B.Ed. Degree Course.
 - f. The candidates who have qualified in Bachelor's degree under Open University System without passing 10th and +2 examinations and subsequently passing 10th and +2 examinations are not eligible for admission to B.Ed. degree programme.
- ix. Candidates who have passed PG degree in Economics and Commerce without undergoing 10+2+3 or 11+1+3 pattern of education shall not be considered for admission.
- x. In the case of Differently Abled, Physically and Visually Challenged Candidates, a minimum pass in the degree is enough.

However, the basis of selection shall be in accordance with the Regulations of the University/Government of Tamil Nadu Guidelines for admission to B.Ed. programme in force from time to time.

ALLOCATION OF SEATS

Reservation of seats for candidates belonging to ST/SC/SCA/MBC/BC/BCM/OC community will be made as per the rules and regulations of the Government of Tamil Nadu.

SPECIAL RESERVATION

Special Categories

Candidates are instructed to enclose appropriate form(s) / certificates as mentioned in **Annexures-I(a), I(b), and II** whichever applicable. If appropriate certificates or supporting documents for special reservation claim are not enclosed, their claim under such categories will not be considered.

Only Tamil Nadu Native candidates are eligible for Special reservation.

Eligibility Criteria for Various Disabilities

a. Norms for Orthopaedic Disability

Candidates with permanent physical impairment of 40% and above are considered as disabled. The candidates with orthopaedic disability of the following types are eligible for claiming Admission against Differently Abled Persons category [**Annexure-I(a) & I(b)**].

- (i) Independent in ambulence with **or** without calipers but without walking aids.
- (ii) Good Standing Balance without calipers but without any support.
- (iii) Hand Function with normal limit without any aid
- (iv) Good control over bladder & bowel
- (v) Disease must be non progressive

b. Norms for Vision Impairment

Candidates with low vision of 40 % and above are considered as disabled, and hence eligible for claiming Admission against Differently Abled Persons category **(Annexure-II)**. Low Vision: Person with low vision means a person with impairment of vision of less than 6/18 to 6/60 with best correction in the better eye or impairment of field in any one of the following categories:

- a) Reduction of fields less than 50 degrees
- b) Heminaopia with macular involvement
- c) Attitudinal defect involving lower fields categories of Visual Disability all with correction

Note:

- (i) Candidates seeking admission against the reservation set apart for orthopaedically Differently Abled Persons / Visually Impaired should produce the certificate from the **Medical Board of the District** concerned certifying the nature and **extent of disability in percentage** and with regard to his/her suitability for admission to B.Ed. Degree Programme specifically mentioned below and in the format appended to this application [**Annexures - I(a), I(b) and II**] respectively. Certificates obtained from an **individual Doctor** will not be considered. **Further, a separate Board for each category will examine the candidates with reference to their certificates before counselling.**
- (ii) Candidates seeking admission against special reservation **should also satisfy the eligibility rules mentioned in item no. viii.** The candidates are also eligible for admission **under general counselling.**

Special Features

The Department of Education provide ample opportunities for the B.Ed. teacher trainees for all round development of their personality and enable them to attain high level of skills and character needed for teacher. The Department offers training on Computers, training in Yoga, Scouts, First Aid and community service. The weekly activity of the Education Association encompasses soft skill development, socially relevant activity, music and sports. A 40 day teaching practice in schools under guidance and supervision of the faculty members is mandatory which provides hands on training. The teaching methodology adopted renders the trainees to face any competitive examination and instruction to the various levels.

METHOD OF SELECTION

1. The selection of candidates will be on the basis of the marks secured in the qualifying UG/PG Degree examination.
2. Candidates will be called for counselling in the order of their rank. Based on the rank and rule of reservations, allotment will be made.
3. Counselling will be held at the Administrative Office, Annamalai University, Annamalainagar, Chidambaram
4. Counselling Fee: Candidates have to pay a Counselling fee of ₹ 2000/- (₹ 1000/- for SC/SCA/ST Candidates) by cash or DD in favour of **“The Registrar, Annamalai University”** payable at **Chennai** at the time of counselling. The counselling fee is **not refundable**.
5. Option once exercised during counselling will be final and cannot be changed.
6. i) The date, time and venue of the counseling will be intimated to the individual candidates by post and also published in the University website.
ii) Candidates will not be considered for selection if he/she fails to (i) report at the specified time and date for counseling, (ii) bring all the certificates in original.
iii) The candidates have to join the University within the time notified in the Admission order, failing which, the seats will be deemed to have fallen vacant. No request for reconsideration of admission thereafter shall be entertained.
7. The provisional selection of the candidates will be cancelled, if he/she fails to remit the fees required to be paid and such allotted seat will be filled by other candidates ad per ranking list.
8. Due to unforeseen reasons, if a candidate **could not** attend the Counselling on the **specified date and time** he/she can attend on a subsequent time/date during that counselling phase and will be allowed to take the programme available at the time of counselling when he/she actually

attends. **(or)** He/She can authorize his/her parent on his/her behalf and the parent's decision will be binding on the candidate. The authorization letter must be in the prescribed format. **(Annexure-IV(a) & IV(b)).**

9. At the time of admission, the Candidate and the parent/Guardian (in case both the parents are not alive) should execute a joint declaration as given in **Annexure-V.**

RANK LISTING

1. i) The percentage of marks obtained by the candidates in major and allied subjects (both in Theory and Practical) in all three years in the UG degree will be taken as the base mark for ranking.
- ii) Candidates who have taken more than one main subject in Part-III (under Double/Triple Major System) of UG degree course should have to choose only one of the main subjects and should have applied for that optional only. In such cases, marks obtained by the candidates in Two/Three major subjects shall be taken into account to arrive percentage of marks.
- iii) Candidates who have qualified in PG degree (5 year Integrated Course) under 10+2+5 or 11+1+5 pattern of study shall be considered for admission. In such cases, the marks obtained by the candidates in the first three years (in major and ancillary or allied subjects alone) of the course alone shall be taken into account for admission to the B.Ed. Degree Course.
- iv) In case of determination of inter-se-merit of candidates with the same marks in the ranking, final ranking of candidates will be declared from the following in the order of merit.
 - a. Marks scored by the candidates in the Major subjects
 - b. Marks scored in Allied-I Subject
 - c. Marks scored in Allied-II Subject
 - d. By random method
2. i) Weightage for the highest qualification of the candidate will be given as follows and added to the base mark for the Ranking. However minimum mark earlier in this prospectus is mandatory.
 - Candidates with PG – 4 marks
 - Candidate with M.Phil. – 5 marks
 - Candidates with Ph.D. – 6 marks
- ii) The higher qualification for which weightage will be given should be in the same subject studied as the main subject in Part-III of the UG degree and preferred as optional subject in B.Ed. course.

iii) Weightage of 3 (three) marks for participation in any one of the following co-curricular activities will be added:

- a) NSS certificate (with two years enrollment in NSS and ten days participation in the Special Camp at college level alone will be considered).
- b) NCC (B and C Certificate at college level).
- c) Sports (Should have represented the college at State / National Level).

SCHOLARSHIPS SANCTIONED BY THE GOVERNMENT OF TAMILNADU

- 1) **Application Fee Concession to SC/ST and Converted Christian Students:** Entrance/Course Application fees concession is granted to students belonging to SC/ST Community and Converted Christian by the Government Tamil Nadu (G.O. No. 111. 22.09.1998).
- 2) **Tuition Fee Concession to SC/ST and Converted Christian Students:** Full Tuition fee concession is granted to students belonging to SC/ST community and converted Christian under the rule 92 of Tamil Nadu Education Rules by the Government of Tamil Nadu [92-TNER].
- 3) **Post Metric Scholarship:** Covering special fees, examination fees, and maintenance charges will be awarded to the students belonging to **SC/ST Community** whose Parent's/Guardian's income from all sources should **not exceed ₹ 2,50,000/- per annum, ST ₹ 2,50,000/- per annum, and Converted Christian (converted from SC/ST) ₹ 2,00,000/- per annum.**

- 4) **Higher Education Special Scholarship:** In addition to the Post Metric Scholarship, Higher Education Special Scholarship is awarded to the hostel students belonging to SC/ST and Converted Christian community and the number of scholarship is limited by the Government. The Annual income from all sources *should not exceed ₹ 2,00,000/- per annum.*
- 5) **BC/MBC/DNC Scholarship:** The Scholarship will be awarded to the Students belonging to **BC/MBC/DNC** communities whose Parent's/ Guardian's income from all sources should not *exceed ₹ 2,00,000/- per annum.*
- 6) **Fee Concession to Blind Students:** Under rule 92 (TNER), Full Tuition fees concession is granted to blind Students belonging to all communities whose parents/Guardians annual Income should not exceeds **₹ 24,000/-**.

Note: All Scholarship income certificate taken after April 2014 should be produced. Except Sl.no.6 the entire fees should be paid by the students at the time of admission and the eligible amount sanctioned by the Government will be reimbursed after receiving from the Government.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS – Common to all Programmes

- 1) Originals of marks-lists or other certificates should not be sent along with the application. Only attested copies of documents need be sent.
- 2) Students who have joined a programme and wish to discontinue must have paid the fees in full up to the year of study.
- 3) In case of candidates who wish to withdraw from the Programme at the same year of admission, who have NOT attended any of the classes and whose seats have been subsequently filled up, a service charge of ₹ 2,000/- will be collected for refund of tuition fee and return of original certificates (except the Transfer/Migration certificate).
- 4) No certificate will be issued unless the candidate has cleared all the arrears of fees etc., due to the University.
- 5) With regard to any dispute arising in relation to admissions, examinations, remittance of fees etc., the place of jurisdiction for the purpose of filing a suit or preferring a complaint or taking any legal proceedings against Annamalai University, will be Chidambaram Town only and not any other place.
- 6) Late applications and applications which are not in the prescribed form or which are not correctly filled in or in respect of which the prescribed certificates and documents are not received on or before the due date and applications which do not otherwise fulfil the terms of the instructions, will be considered defective and are liable for rejection. The University will not be responsible for any postal or other kinds of delay for the receipt of applications after the due date.

Original Certificates submitted at the time of admission are not returnable till the end of the Programmes. Before the certificates are surrendered for admission, the candidates are advised to have with them attested copies of mark

lists or other certificates that may be required to applying for scholarship etc.
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ADMISSION TO FOREIGN STUDENTS

Students who are selected under various scholarship schemes, either by the Ministry of Education and Culture or the Ministry of External Affairs, will be given admission on the recommendations/sponsorship of the respective Ministry. Self supporting foreign students seeking admission should possess a student VISA issued by the Indian Embassies abroad and produce a No Objection Certificate from the Ministry of Education, Government of India, after clearance from the Ministry of External Affairs.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR ALL PROGRAMMES

The following code of conduct shall be observed by the students who are admitted.

- a. The students should conduct themselves in an exemplary manner so as to be model for other students.
- b. All students will have to strictly adhere to the rules and regulations of the University.
- c. **RAGGING:** The candidates should not indulge or participate in any kind of ragging. If they are found to have indulged in ragging in the past, or noticed later, the candidates will be removed from the roll of the institution at whatever stage of study and criminal action will be taken against the candidates.
- d. **If any student is involved in ragging or any other anti- social activities, he/she will be expelled and criminal proceedings may be launched against him/her.**
- e. The students should be present during all working days and sincerely apply themselves to studies.
- f. The students should attend the classes regularly and punctually and should fulfil the attendance requirement of 75% as prescribed by the University, to be eligible to appear for the University Examinations.
- g. The campus is “Tobacco Free” and “Liquor Free”. Any violation of this will result in dismissal from the programme.
- h. Use of mobile phones and other electronic gadgets are not permitted in the class rooms, examination halls, faculty premises, university organized functions/programmes/extracurricular and co-curricular activities.

- i. The students are forbidden from using motorized vehicles, including powered two wheelers, inside the campus.
- j. **Dress Code:** Students need to wear formal dress largely covering them like Sarees/Churidhar with dupatta for ladies and Trousers, Pant & Shirt for men. Use of T.Shirts/Jeans and other modern outfits should be avoided during working hours and formal functions.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The following procedures should be followed for applying/getting certificates viz. Bonafide/Course completion/Mark lists etc. with the fee prescribed by the University.

- a. **General:** Mark list for each Semester/Year during the period of study will be issued by the University and distributed through the respective departments of study. On completion of the programme, Provisional Certificate and Transfer Certificate will also be distributed through the department concerned.
- b. **Migration Certificate:** This certificate will be issued by the University Office ('K' Section) only on demand to those who have planned to undergo higher studies in any Educational Institution in India.
- c. **Duplicate Certificate- Mark List/Degree/Transfer Certificate:** A certificate from the police department is required to be produced for the loss of certificates indicating that the certificates were actually lost beyond recovery.
- d. **Degree Certificate:** Notification will be issued in the leading dailies during the month of September/October every year inviting application forms for obtaining Degree Certificate at the Convocation. Students shall apply for the same in the prescribed form which can be obtained from the University.
- e. **Personal File:** Students while admitted in this University must open a personal file to maintain all academic records such as challan for remittance of tuition fee, exam fee, instrument fee, condonation fee etc. till completion of his/her studies.
- f. **Re-admission:** If any attendance deficiency during the tenure of his/her studies, candidates shall apply for re-admission through the Heads concerned along with the photocopy of his/her previous semester/year mark list(s) as proof for having appeared for the University Examinations.
- g. **How to get Certificate:**
 - i. Students applied for any certificates in this University viz., Bonafide, Course Completion, Duplicate mark list, Degree Certificate and Transfer Certificate etc, either during the tenure of his/her studies or completion of

the programme should obtain the same from the office or by post within a fortnight period from the date of filing application in the office. He/she should possess compulsorily a) a copy of letter through which he/she has applied for b) a copy of remittance challan and c) any other documents, whenever any lapse of the original submitted to University (or) loss in transaction.

- ii. If candidates do not receive the certificate/s within the stipulated period, then he/she can immediately seek the assistance of the Section Head/Deputy Registrar of the 'K' Section with relevant copy of records that has been already submitted for claiming the certificates, so as to enable them to get the certificate from the office (or) necessary guidance will be provided for the same.
- iii. Students admitted on various programmes of the University, should get back his/her original certificates produced at the time of admission within three months either on completion of programme (or) discontinuing the same in the middle of the programme. The University is not responsible for any lapse or damage of the certificates, beyond this period.

1. This certificate should be issued by an officer of the Revenue Department not below the rank of Tahsildar in the Taluk concerned.
2. This certificate should not be issued by the Special Tahsildars, Deputy Tahsildars such as Loans, Land Acquisition, Election, Excise and HQs, Deputy Tahsildars, Special Deputy Collectors, Assistant Commissioner of Agricultural Income, Excise, Elections etc.
3. The certificate should bear the stamp of the office of the Officer signing the certificate.
4. Any foreign national irrespective of the period of study in the State will not become eligible to apply for this course. No certificate of Nativity in the State of Tamil Nadu, should therefore be issued to Nationals of other countries for this purpose.
5. The certifying officers should insist upon clear proof of the nativity of the parent or guardian of the candidate and satisfy themselves on the genuineness of the residential qualification.
6. **They should be particularly careful in the case of candidates whose mother tongue is not Tamil and whose place of birth is other than Tamil Nadu and who have studied VIII to XII standards outside Tamil Nadu.**
7. **Residence Certificate will not be considered as Nativity Certificate.**
8. The guidelines prescribed for the issue of Nativity Certificate and they are as follows as per Letter No.RA.V(B)16932/2000, dated 3-4-2000 of the Special Commissioner and Commissioner of Revenue Administration, Chepauk, Chennai-5.
 - i. The parents/guardians of the applicants/students or the applicants themselves should have permanently resided continuously for a period of five years in Tamil Nadu.
 - ii. Permanently residing for a period of five years should be supported by documentary evidence.
 - iii. The family ration card, Electoral Roll, Census List if taken recently, documents like sale deed, tax receipt etc. relating to the property owned by either of the parents or by the applicant may be verified.
 - iv. The Transfer Certificate issued by the School authorities where the applicant had studied last may be verified to know whether he/she was in the State for five years.
 - v. Enquiry in the village/place of residence of the neighbour/Village Administrative Officers regarding continuous residing.
 - vi. To ensure that wrong or incorrect address had not been furnished to obtain the certificate.
 - vii. The birth place of the parent, place of residence of the parent/father, permanent assets, mother tongue, place of education, place of marriage of the applicant/parents, the period of stay in and outside Tamil Nadu can also be considered before issuing certificate.
