Stakeholder's Feedback and Student Satisfaction Survey-2019-20: An Analysis

Inferences of the feedback obtained during 2019-20 are,

1. Academic programmes which do not have the components of Industrial visits, internships & implant training need to be identified and restructured.
2. Provisions must be made in the curriculum to enhance soft skills and employability
3. Summer projects, internships, study tours and experiential learning should be compulsory in all the programmes wherever feasible.
4. Space for extracurricular activities should be augmented and hostel amenities and ambiance should be improved to the satisfactory level.
5. Extended timings of laboratory to facilitate lab research in after hours.
6. Timings of morning classes in the Faculty of Agriculture should be changed.
7. Printed practical manuals should be given as followed earlier to ease out time constraint in preparation of records in Agriculture programmes.
8. Existing fee structure may be revised and reduced.

Based on the Stakeholders feedback & Student Satisfactory Survey 2019-2020, the following suggestions are placed before academic council for further action.

1. Programmes which do not have the components of Industrial visits, internships, in-plant training, soft skills, employability courses, summer projects, study tour and practical Learning need to be identified and included with the above said components wherever feasible.
2. More space for extracurricular activities would be augmented, and hostel amenities and ambiance will be improved to the satisfactory level.
3. The specific suggestions on inclusion of course contents opined by the alumni are to be transferred to the departments of studies concerned for assessing their validity and feasibility to be considered in due course of syllabus revision.
4. Minor shortfalls in lab equipments and practical facilities need to be addressed by Departments of studies concerned.
5. The grievances on timings of laboratory for research, morning classes in the Faculty of Agriculture, printed practical manuals and fee structure may be considered.

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
