About the University:

In the early 1920s Rajah Sir S. R. M. Annamalai Chettiar founded Sri Minakshi college, Sri Minakshi Tamil College and Sri Minakshi Sanskrit College at Chidambaram. In 1928, Rajah Sir S. R. M. Annamalai Chettiar agreed with the local Government to handover the above said institution for establishing a University. Thus, on 01.01.1929 Annamalai University was established as per Annamalai University Act 1928 (Tamil Nadu Act 1 of 1929).

One of the most significant developments is the enactment of the Annamalai University Act, 2013 (Tamil Nadu Act 20 of 2013), which has come into force from September 25, 2013. Annamalai University is accredited with 'A' Grade by NAAC in 2014. "The NIRF-2019" by the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) has ranked the University in the band 101 - 150 in the overall category as well as the University Category. In the Pharmacy Category the ranking is 12th in India. In the Medical Category the ranking is 25th. "The Times Higher Education World University Ranking - 2020" has ranked Annamalai University in 1000+ for Overall category. In the Subject category Ranking, 2019, the University is ranked in the band of 501-600 for Life Sciences, 601+ in Pre-clinical, clinical & Health Subjects, 801+ in the Physical Sciences subject and Engineering. "The QS World University Ranking - 2020" has ranked Annamalai University in the band of 291 - 300 in Asia Ranking, and 39 in India Ranking. "The CWTS Leiden Ranking 2019", on scientific impact of universities and on universities' involvement in scientific collaboration & scientific performance, has ranked the University at 23rd based on the number of publications and 7th based on the proportion of publications that, compared with other publications in the same field and in the same year, belong to the top 10% most frequently cited. Among the top 212 ranked institutions for Higher Education in India the "SCImago Institutional Ranking (2019)" has ranked Annamalai University as 9th in Tamil Nadu and 29th in India.

Annamalai University is one of the largest unitary, teaching, and residential Universities in Southern Asia comprising of 10 Faculties and 49 departments of study. This University has played a

pivotal role in providing access to higher education to thousands of youth cutting across the social spectrum, especially from economically and socially disadvantaged classes. In this respect, this University's service to the nation is tremendous.

About the Department

The Department of Business Administration is the largest component of the Faculty of Arts, which strives everyday in its academic and research endeavors to inculcate skills for the prospective professional managers and entrepreneurs - the ideas of Business Management.

Five M.B.A programmes of multi-teach have been introduced in the Department to meet the growing demands of young learners for appropriate placement. Both academic pursuits and research progress are in tune with the strides made elsewhere, and the results of this endeavor has motivated researchers in qualifying themselves for the Ph.D degree. The Department has 347 Ph.D's, and 230 M.Phil's., and more than 1000 research papers published in reputed national and international journals to its credit. National Commission for Women

The National Commission for Women (NCW) is a Statutory body of the Government of India, generally concerned with advising the government on all policy matters affecting women. It was established in January 1992 under the provisions of the Indian Constitution, as defined in the 1990 National Commission for Women Act. The first head of the commission was Jayanti Patnaik. On 29 September 2014 Lalitha Kumaramangalam was appointed as Chairperson.

The objective of the NCW is to represent the rights of women in India and to provide a voice for their issues and concerns. The subjects of their campaigns have included dowry, politics, religion, equal representation for women in jobs, and the exploitation of women for labour.

Legal Awareness Programme

Aims to empower women and girls with the knowledge of laws related to women, legal rights

and duties, to enable them, to share power equally, gainful access to the means of development and to inspire a whole generation of women to work together towards achieving equality and justice.

Objectives of Legal Awareness Programme

- ❖ To impart knowledge about the basic legal rights and remedies provided under various women related laws.
- ❖ To make the women aware of the various organs of the justice delivery system available for redressal of their problems/grievances.
- ❖ The procedure of approaching and utilizing various channels available for the redressal of grievances i.e., the Police, the Executive and the Judiciary.
- ❖ The role of courts in achieving gender equality, most importantly the concept of Public Interest Litigation.
- ❖ To Sensitize women and Girls about their Rights as provided under various laws including the Indian Penal Code, 1860; the Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961; the Prevention of Domestic Violence to Women Act, 2005; the Sexual Harassment of women at Workplace- 2013 etc.
