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

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

ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

In the early 1920s Rajah Sir S.R.M. Annamalai Chettiar founded Sri Minakshi College, Sri Minakshi Tamil college and Sri Minakshi Sankrit College at Chidambaram. In 1928, Rajah Sir S.R.M. Annamalai Chettiar agreed with the local Government to handover the above said institution for establishing a University. Thus, on 01.01.1929 Annamalai University was established as per Annamalai University Act 1928 (Tamil Nadu Act 1 of 1929).

One of the most significant developments is the enactment of the Annamalai University Act, 2013 (Tamil Nadu Act 20 of 2013), which has come into force from September 25, 2013. Annamalai University is accredited with 'A' Grade by NAAC in 2014. It is ranked 4th in Tamil Nadu and 20th among the top 100 institutions for Higher Education in India by "SCImago Institutional Ranking". Annamalai University is rated as the top Indian Institute in Pharmacology with highest Subject area publication count in Pharmacology.

Annamalai University is one of the largest unitary, teaching, and residential University in Southern Asia comprising of 10 Faculties and 49 departments of study. This University has played a pivotal role in providing access to higher education to thousands of youth cutting across the social spectrum, especially from economically and socially disadvantaged classes. In this respect, this University's service to the nation is tremendous.

ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT

The Department of Sociology, initially known as the Department of Rural, Civic, and Social Welfare, was established in the year 1954. During the formative years, three Fulbright American Professors helped in designing the academic courses and also initiated research activities. The Department collaborates with leading National and International NGOs for academic and research initiatives. The Department actively engages the students in extension activities such as Village Adoption, Blood Donation, and Camps for Awareness Creation in the surrounding villages. The Department has successfully completed nine (3 Major; 6 Minor) Research Projects funded by UGC. In 2018, the Department was renamed as Sociology and Social Work. The Department is currently assisted by the UGC SAP-DRS (Phase-II) category to the tune of Rs. 93.5 lakhs for a period of five years (2015-2020).

ABOUT THE SEMINAR

Globalization is a process that promotes world-wide exchange of national and cultural resources. It includes economic globalization, social cultural globalization, and environmental globalization. Global

climate change, ozone layer depletion, reduction of biodiversity, over consumption of natural resources, desertification are all global environmental degradations brought after the economic globalization. The industrial revolution uses large amount of natural resources as materials in the process, as well as the deterioration of their quality as a consequence of pollution. The acceleration of economic growth led to the increasing of world population that promoted the deterioration of environment. The increasing pace of globalization and how it affects the environment has been a major global concern.

The concept of sustainability means that something is maintained for a period of long time which is associated with the integration of economic, social, and environmental development to "meet the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs". The notion of sustainable development rapidly gained wide currency and encouraged a greater awareness of the major environmental problems and international disparities.

Economic globalization impacts the environment and sustainable development in a wide variety of ways and through a multitude of channels. Globalization brings with it potentially large benefits as well as risks. The challenge is to manage the process of globalization in such a way that it promotes environmental sustainability and equitable human development. In this context the links between globalization, environment and sustainability need to be re-examined and recognized. To ignore these links is to misunderstand the full extent and nature of globalization and to miss out on critical opportunities to address some of the most pressing environmental challenges faced by humanity.
