



The National Cadet Corps is the Indian military cadet corps with its head Quarters at New Delhi. It is open to school and college students on voluntary basis. The National Cadet Corps in India are a voluntary organization which recruits cadets from high schools, colleges and Universities all over India. The Cadets are given basic military training in small arms and parades. The officers and cadets have no liability for active military service once they complete their course but are given preference over normal candidates during selections based on the achievements in the corps.

NCC History

The NCC in India was formed with the National Cadet Corps Act of 1948. It was raised on 15 July 1948 The National Cadet Corps can be considered as a successor of the University Officers Training Corps (UOTC) which was established by the British in 1942. During World War II, the UOTC never came up to the expectations set by the British. This led to the idea that some better schemes should be formed, which could train more young men in a better way, even during peace times. A committee headed by Pandit H.N. Kunzru recommended a cadet organization to be established in schools and colleges at a national level. The National Cadet Corps Act was accepted by the Governor General and on 15 July 1948 the National Cadet Corps came into existence.

During the 1965 and 1971 wars with Pakistan, NCC cadets were the second line of defence. They organised camps to assist the ordinance factories, supplying arms and ammunition to the front, and also were used as patrol parties to capture the enemy paratroopers. The NCC cadets also worked hand in hand with the Civil Defence authorities and actively took part in rescue work and traffic control. After the 1965 and 1971 Indo-Pak wars the NCC syllabus was revised. Rather than just being the second line of defence, NCC syllabus laid a greater stress on developing qualities of leadership and Officer-like qualities. The military training which the NCC cadets received was reduced and greater importance was given to other areas like social service and youth-management.

NCC Organisation

The National Cadet Corpos is headed by a Director General, an Army Officer of the rank of Lieutanant General, who is responsible for the functioning of the National Cadet Corps in the country through the National Cadet Corps Headquarters situated at Delhi. At the State Level, the country has been divided into 17 Directorates covering all States and Union Territories. Each of the State National Cadet Corps Directorate Headquarters controls two to fourteen Group Headquarters. While Directorates are commanded by Brigadiers or their equivalents, the Groups are commanded by Colonels or equivalents from the Air Force and the Navy. NCC Units are commanded by Major/Lieutenant Colonel or their equivalents.







NCC at Annamalai University

National Cadet Corps in Annamalai University was started in 1949. The NCC of this university has a strong alumni base, most of them occupying coveted positions in many public services, educational, industrial, defence and research organizations all over the world. The NCC of our university has long record of meritorious contribution towards the Republic Day and Independence Day. NCC activities in our University have evoked much enthusiasm among the students. The Cadets are given basic military training in regular parades with necessary training aids. The officers and cadets have no liability for active military service once they complete their course but are given preference over normal candidates during selections based on the achievements in the corps. At present, there are two (Army and Naval) wings in our university comprising of cadets who are actively indulging in all NCC activities to make our faculties, University and our Nation proud.

The NCC in Annamalai University has two units such as 4(TN) Composite Technical Coy, NCC (Army Wing- Senior Division) and 6 (TN) Battalion, NCC located at Annamalainagar. The Officer's who are in charge of their respective platoon is called Associate NCC Officers (ANO's) who are working as Associate Professors in Faculty Engineering and Technology, Faculty of Agriculture and Faculty of Education.

NCC in Faculty of Engineering and Technology is subservient to 4(TN) Composite Technical Coy, NCC (Army Wing- Senior Division), Annamalainagar and this technical company which composes the Engineers platoon, Signal platoon and EME.

Naval wing is attached with the 5 (TN) Naval, NCC at Cuddalore comprising of Naval wing- Senior Division.

NCC in Faculty of Agriculture and Faculty of Education are attached with the 6 (TN) Bn, NCC at Annamalainagar comprising of Army wing- Senior Division.

At present, there are Army and Naval wings in our University comprising of about 410 cadets who are actively indulging in all NCC activities to make our University and our Nation proud.

Aims of NCC

- 1. To develop qualities of character, courage, comradeship, discipline, leadership, secular outlook, spirit of adventure and sportsmanship and the ideals of selfless service among the youth to make them useful citizen.
- 2. To create a human resource of organised trained and motivated youth to provide leadership in all walks of life including the Armed Forces and be always available for the service of the nation.

Core Values

The NCC is a responsive, learning and continuously evolving organization. Its activity is guided by certain core values that we endeavour to instil among all ranks of the NCC. These include the following:-

- a. A sense of patriotic commitment to encourage cadets to contribute to national development.

- g. Sensitivity to the needs of poor and socially disadvantaged fellow citizens.
- h. Inculcating habits of restraint and self-awareness.
- i. Understanding the values of honesty, truthfulness, self-sacrifice, perseverance and hard work.
- j. Respect for knowledge, wisdom and the power of ideas.

Certification Programme

General

The eligibility conditions and the general procedure for the conduct of the Certificate Examination for Cadets of Senior Division/Wings NCC (All wings) have been issued by the HQ from time to time. The aim of this Directive is to consolidate all such instruction and revise these, where necessary.

Type of Examination

The type of Certificate Examination and the unit in which these are held are given below

Type of Certificate NCC Unit

Certificate 'B'& 'C' Sei

Senior Division/Wing NCC

Eligibilities for Certificate Examination

Certificate B

- 1. The cadet must have attended a minimum of 75% of total training periods laid down in the syllabus for the first and second years for Senior Division/Wing NCC (All Wings).
- Break in the NCC Training Tenure of the cadet SD/ SW prior to appearing in the exam should not exceed more than 18 months at one time after his discharge to count his tenure for Certificate B Examination.
- 3. In case the break exceeds 18 months the following procedure will be adopted :
 - a. If he had been on the unit rolls for a minimum of two years before his discharge and had attended 75% of the total periods during his NCC Tenure he will need another 36 periods of training to become eligible to appear for Certificate B Examination.
 - b. In all other cases where above conditions are not fulfilled the cadet must attend a minimum of 75% periods of the first & second years of training.
- 4. Must have attended one Annual Training Camp /NIC /COC / RDC / Attachment with Regular Army/Navy
- 5. Cadets possessing Certificate A will be awarded 10 bonus marks.

Certificate C

- 1. The cadet must be in possession of Certificate B.
- 2. The cadet must be in third year of Senior Division/Senior Wing NCC Training.
- 3. The cadet must have attended a minimum of 75% of the periods of 3rdyear syllabus during the academic session.





- 4. Break in the NCC Training Tenure of the cadet SD/SW prior to appearing in the Exam should not exceed more than 18 months at one time after his discharge to count his previous tenure for Certificate C examination.
- 5. In case the break exceeds 18 months the following procedure will be adopted:
 - a. If he had been on the unit rolls for a minimum of two years before his discharge and attended 75% of the total period during his NCC Tenure he will need another 30 periods of training to become eligible for Certificate C examination.
 - b. In other cases where above conditions are not fulfilled, the cadet must attend a minimum of 75% periods of the third year of training.
- 6. Must have attended one ATC and in addition one of the following in a three year tenure:
 - a. Annual Training Camp (This is in addition to one mentioned above).
 - b. Republic Day Camp at Delhi (RDC).
 - c. Centrally Organized Camp (COC). Ordered by HQ DGNCC
 - d. Para Training Camp (PTC).
 - e. National Integration Camp (NIC) (When applicable for SD/ SW Cadets).
 - f. All India Trekking Expedition (HQ DGNCC Organized).
 - g. All India Mountaineering Expedition (HQ DGNCC Organized).
 - h. Attachment Training with any one of the following:-

i.Army Unit.

ii.Naval Base/ Establishment/ Ship/ Sea Training.

- i. Any one of the following Adventure Courses:
 - i. Mountaineering Basic Course.
 - ii. Mountaineering Advance Course.
 - iii. Water Skiing/Snow Skiing Courses.
 - iv. Snow & Ice (Condensed) Course.
- j. Sailing expedition with actual sailing exceeding 10 days, duly approved by HQ DGNCC.
- k. Participated in NRAI matches as part of HQ DGNCC/Directorate team.
- I. Scuba Diving Course.
- m. Youth Exchange Programme.
- n. Foreign cruise (Navy or Coast Guard).
- 7. Cadets will be allowed to appear for Certificate C examination only after one year of passing Certificate B examination.
